- 1. Projects and or/accomplishments in 2024:
- We continued to monitor the annual budget and finances of the Auxiliary, and look to the future.
- The \$25,000 promo CD (12-month 5% APY) we had at the Commerce Bank in St. Joseph, MO matured on 2/23/24. We researched current rates and the finance committee recommended to the executive board that we withdraw the \$917.66 interest in the CD and transfer it to our checking account and start a new 11-month CD at 4.85% APY at Commerce Bank. The executive board approved and this was completed in March. In addition, at their November 2023 meeting the executive board voted to earmark \$2,500 of the profit from the sale of the 70th Anniversary portraits and prints over the past two years to a new line item, "the 75th Anniversary Fund". The finance committee voted to add this amount taken from our checking account to the \$25,000 CD to make a total 11-month CD of \$27,500. This will provide easy tracking and interest will be earned on it.
- At the November 2023 executive board meeting the decision was made to not move 25% of our annual profit to one of our endowment funds due to the limited profit in the 2023 fiscal year, primarily due to receipt of receivables at the end of the fiscal year. We received a Harvey Rattey commission check in October, 2023 for \$371.62 which was transferred to our Scholarship Endowment.
- The executive board approved the transfer of \$6,000 from the Full Circle Online Auction proceeds to the Auxiliary Scholarship endowment fund (\$5,000) and the Auxiliary Educational Awards endowment fund (\$1,000). This was completed in June.
- We continued to report income and expenses against each of our activities/projects whenever possible, to provide a true profit statement on any fundraisers.
- We want to thank Amy Griffin for her service and the great job she has done as our bookkeeper for the past two and a half years.
