American Angus Auxiliary Spring Council Meeting

Saturday, April 22, 2023 in Hermann, Missouri and via Zoom

President Julie Conover called the meeting to order at 9:10 am. Julie then introduced the Executive Board, Committee Chairs, State Presidents/State Contacts, Charter Members, Distinguished Women and Past Presidents.

Attended in person in Hermann, Missouri: Julie Conover, Karla Knapp, Deanna Hofing, Stacy Erdmann, Lori Pillars, Cindy Worthington, Megan Ahearn, Christy Perdue, Valerie Trowbridge, and Tonya Theis. Zoom Attendees: Anne Patton Schubert, Nancy Thelen, Nancy Sullivan, Gina Hope, Julie Murnin, Amy Griffin, Cindy Ahearn, Meredith Nowotny, Pam Velisek, Susan Quam, Lynne Hinrichsen, Meghan Ressler, Moxley Jandd, and Reid(?).

Minutes of the October 16, 2022 Council Meeting were presented. Anne Patton Schubert moved to approve. Reid seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Tonya Theis presented the Treasurers Report.

Committee Reports

Finance – Nancy Thelen reported that all bank accounts from BMO in St. Joseph are now all in Commerce Bank. After researching the rates and communicating with the finance committee, the Executive Board received the following recommendation: Close the remaining BMO account and move those funds to Commerce Bank and open the 12-month CD with \$25,000 for the special 3.75% interest rate with the additional funds coming from our money market account. The Executive Board voted to approve this action on February 9 and the Amy Griffin and Nancy Thelen have been coordinating these efforts.

Scholarship – Karla Knapp reported that states are gathering their scholarship applicants and preparing for the May 1st deadline. Scholarship Awards amounts were voted on during our Executive Board meeting on April 21, 2023 and include award the scholarships in 2023 with \$10,000 for males and \$10,000 for females with the following breakdown: First \$2,200; Second \$2,100; Third \$2,000; Fourth \$1,900; and Fifth \$1,800.

Full Circle Online Auction (FCOA) – Christy Perdue gave a report for the FCOA Auction. The auction will be held on November 9, 2023. Beginning in 2023, FCOA will only be accepting items that are 100% proceeds and will no longer offer the option to share the profit.

Gifts that Sizzle – Deanna Hofing reported that we are working on some new strategies for the program. The committee is looking at different ideas for "box" sets and strategies for corporate gifting. CAB is willing to help with the marketing of the box sets. Deanna was asked about the gifts sold over the holidays. CAB reported that the link was not correct. People were unable to order from our link. Therefore, we may not have any income. Deanna also reported that the problem has been fixed, but we are unsure the amount if any that we will have for income.

Distinguished Women - Deanna Hofing asked if anyone had nominations for Distinguished Women to please get in touch with her or the committee members.

Nominating - Deanna Hofing reminded the council that we are also looking for nominations for Secretary/Treasurer and Regional Directors for 4, 5 and 6. Please reach out to Deanna if you know of anyone that would be interested.

CAB Cook-Off - Anne Patton Schubert announced that she would love to have any and all help that they can get in Nebraska for the 40Th Anniversary of the CAB Cook-Off.

OLD BUSINESS

CJ Brown Fundraiser - Deanna Hofing reported that we brought in over \$14,000 at the National Convention and the Full Circle Auction print brought over \$500. We only have approximately 40 prints left and have sold over \$7,000 in prints. Remaining prints till be taken to the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS) to be sold in AGB.

Miss American Angus Empowerment Verbiage – Deanna Hofing continued to work with the American Angus Association legal staff and Miss American Angus chairpersons to determine the correct verbiage for the handbook and letter of intent. Our executive committee voted on and approved the verbiage: "In this role, your goals will be promoting empowerment, self-confidence and service among biological women involved in the breed."

Angus Gift Barn – Julie Conover reported the profit/loss from the years 2019 to present as prepared by Accountant Amy Griffin:

- 2019: \$5,148.07

- 2020: -\$2,531.92 (purse raffle used to help cover the loss)

2021: \$79.182022: -\$5,528.99

- 2023 as of 4.21.23: \$86.86

The Angus Gift Barn will look a little different this year at National Junior Angus Show. We are having three sections in the gift barn. New Items, Sale Items and Clearance Items. We will be rebranding the booth space and having a few targeted items to sell, educational section and a place for people to gather and visit with each other.

We are also actively looking for a gift barn manager.

NEW BUSINESS

Miss American Angus Crowing Location – After being approached by AAA staff about possibly moving the crowning of MAA to the NJAS, the executive board discussed the option and brought it to the Council for their vote. Megan Ahearn moved to keep the crowning of Miss American Angus at Angus Convention in November. Gina Hope seconded the motion. Motion passed.

One hundred forty juniors competed as 27 teams. Winners in Recipe and Showmanship were chosen among Roast, Steak and Other Beef Item (Ground Beef this Year) divisions. The Black Kettle winner was the Nebraska Senior Roast team. The Ardyce's Apron winner was the Virginia Junior Ground Beef team. The Pat Grote LEAD Scholarship Winner was the Illinois Intermediate Steak team.

1. Projects and or/accomplishments in 2023:

- We continue to monitor the annual budget and finances of the Auxiliary.
- The last CD we had at BMO in St. Joseph, MO matured on 2/09/23. We researched current rates and the finance committee recommended to the executive board that we close out the CD and withdraw the \$5,371 in the CD at BMO bank and move it to our money market (savings) account at Commerce Bank, and then take \$25,000 from our money market account and put it into their Business 12 Month Promo CD special with an APY of 3.75%. If it would become necessary to break the CD we would not be charged a penalty. The executive board approved the recommendation, and this was completed at the end of February.
- All of the American Angus Auxiliary accounts at BMO in St. Joseph, MO have been moved to Commerce Bank in St. Joseph. This is the bank that the AAA uses.
- The executive committee approved our recommendation to transfer \$6000 from the Full Circle Auction proceeds to the scholarship endowment fund. This was completed in May.
- We continue to report income and expenses against each of our activities/projects whenever possible, to provide a true profit statement on any fundraisers.
- We are developing the annual budget for 2023-24.
- We want to thank Amy Griffin for her continuing service and the great job she is doing as our bookkeeper.

- Review of 2022-23 fiscal year and budget for 2023-24.





As Authored by Past President Lois Foster in July 2023 with modifications made in October 2023



This document reiterates clarification and understanding, and rules of authority of the American Angus Auxiliary to accompany the Guidelines and legal documents of this long-standing national organization.

Be it clearly understood and with exclusive, honest adherence, this declaration be considered equal to the by-laws. The current symbol, as shown above, is the official symbol of the American Angus Auxiliary. It is permanent and exclusive.

This Reaffirmation of Perpetuity of the Symbol is indeed necessary in light of current American society fad of alteration and/or changing symbols or logos of business, organizations, advertising, etc. The American Angus Auxiliary Symbol is essential and assists and reminds user of its importance and legacy, plus the clarity of the originality, honor, meaning, pride and respect.

Beyond improving for reproduction purposes, the logo cannot be altered, changed, disposed of, nor colors of black, white true red, be changed. Use of the symbol, by anyone, in any place, for any reason must be by permission of the American Angus Executive Board.

Auxiliaries of states of the United States are advised to adhere to the symbol declaration and be assisted in knowledge by American Angus Auxiliary Officers.




